#### **Meeting Minutes**

Anthony Hallman made a motion to approve the April 6, 2017 WNCSB meeting minutes. Second by Angela Ahlgrim. Unanimously approved.

## **Board Chair and Vice Chair Elections**

Anthony Hallman made a motion to nominate Paula Horning as the WNCSB Chair. Second by Angela Ahlgrim. Unanimously approved. Anthony Hallman made a motion to nominate Christine Beatty as the WNCSB Vice Chair. Second by Angela Ahlgrim. Unanimously approved.

#### Update from Program Director Association

## **Update from CNCS State Office**

John Hosteny introduced himself. He provided information on CNCS budget timeline- FY 2017 working on continuing resolution, FY 2018 begins October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017. He also provided information on the three recent CNCS council appointments who will be starting in the next couple of weeks along with information on three funding opportunities that are closing soon (AmeriCorps Affiliates, VGF, and Civic Engagement Research).

## **Update from Commission Members**

Jana Steinmetz thanked Daria Rydzak for her work with the 2017 Governor's Service Recognition Event. Christine Beatty gave a report about her recent trip to the ASC North Central Regional Conference in Columbus, Ohio, and highlighted the importance of service in the lives of older adults as well as the importance of volunteer recognition. Mark Beres talked about his efforts to identify a state-wide organization that could support an AmeriCorps program targeted to veterans. He is also working on veteran outreach efforts with the CNCS Wisconsin State Office and Serve Wisconsin. Scott Jones stated that a draft of the Every Student Succeeds Act is on the DPI website. #### **Staff Updates**

Steven Yule read an update from Executive Director Jeanne Duffy that discussed Serve Wisconsin's success with competitive funding, plans for continuing outreach, upcoming events and trainings, vacant board positions and board reappointments, and filling the two open Serve Wisconsin Program Officer positions. Steven gave an update on the IPERA process. Daria Rydzak spoke about planning outreach summits in the fall. Casey Sweeney gave an update on the Feeding Wisconsin planning grant, spoke about attending the WACAC Conference to promote AmeriCorps, and mentioned the upcoming media campaign with the Wisconsin Broadcasters Association.

#### 2017-2018 Formula Funding- Committee Recommendations

Steven Yule provided an explanation of the process Serve Wisconsin staff went through to allocate the 2017-2018 AmeriCorps Formula funds as described in the Program Evaluation and Development Committee Recommendations 2017-2018 Program Year document.

Anthony Hallman moved to approve the PE&D Committee's 2017-2018 Formula Funding Recommendation outlined as follows:

Anthony Hallman motioned to add a waiver for the 80% performance scoring threshold requirement for Milwaukee Christian Center based on their corrective action plan and their report of improvements. Second by Jane Moore. Motion passed unanimously.

The motion to approve the PE&D Committee's 2017-2018 Formula Funding Recommendation was seconded by Angela Ahlgrim. Motion passed unanimously.

After funding these programs, Serve Wisconsin has an excess of \$1,494,634 that will not be requested from the Corporation for National and Community Service.

Discussion followed on how the WNCSB can change policies to reduce burdens on program applicants, why the organizations that submitted a RFP Notice of Intent did not choose to apply, and how to ensure the success of planning grant applicants moving forward.

## 2017-2018 Planning Grants- Committee Recommendations

Anthony Hallman and Casey Sweeney gave an overview of the planning grant applicants listed in the Program Evaluation and Development Committee Recommendations 2017-2018 Program Year document.

Anthony Hallman moved to approve the PE&D Committee's 2017-2018 Planning Grant Recommendation outlined as follows:

The motion to approve the PE&D Committee's 2017-2018 Planning Grant Funding Recommendation was seconded by Christine Beatty. Motion passed unanimously.

After funding these planning grants, Serve Wisconsin has an excess of \$1,200,571 that will not be requested from the Corporation for National and Community Service.

#### Committee Recommendations- Formula Funding Policies

Anthony Hallman made a motion to revise RFP policy to include an option allowing current Formula funded grantees who do not meet the 20 member threshold for Competitive funding to apply for up to two additional years of Continuation Formula funding, for a maximum of three consecutive years of Formula funding (beginning with those programs receiving Formula funding for 2017-2018), and being required to apply for Competitive funding for the year following the third year of Formula funding. Formula funded grantees would not be required to apply for second and third year Continuation Formula funding and could choose to apply for Competitive funding instead of applying for a second or third year of Continuation Formula funding.

Discussion followed on how this revision would benefit current and new programs.

Angela Ahlgrim seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Anthony Hallman made a motion to revise RFP policy to state that an organization can apply for and receive no more than two Formula funded Planning Grants over a period of two program years (maximum of one grant per year) to plan for AmeriCorps programming that would address the same need with the same program design.

Discussion followed on what constituted same need and same program design along with who would be responsible for determining eligibility.

Angela Ahlgrim seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
